## Aims of funding

- Grow capacity and capability among English higher education providers to deliver high quality degree apprenticeships provision that meet skills needs now and in the future.
- Increase the number and diversity of apprentices on degree apprenticeship programmes, improving student choice and access to routes into and through higher education.



## **Anticipated outcomes of funding**

- Expansion of existing provision among providers **already offering** degree apprenticeships (strand 1)
- Expansion of provision among providers new to the degree apprenticeships market (strand 2)
- Increased starts and evidenced growth among apprentices in lower socioeconomic groups and young people, and other groups underrepresented in apprenticeships provision that align with OfS objectives (cross cutting theme)



## Who is eligible to bid?



- OfS registered providers in Approved fee cap registration category leading bids for funding.
- Existing providers already on Register of Apprenticeships Training Providers (RoATP) expanding recruitment to existing apprenticeships; and offering apprenticeships for the first time based on existing occupational standards.
- Providers either in process of, or about to start process of RoATP registration.



## What's expected to be in and out of scope

#### In:

- Activity to increase starts on Degree Apprenticeships
- Collaborative bids
- Development costs including provider staffing costs and employer engagement activity
- Activity to widen participation on Degree Apprenticeships, including pipelines from levels 4 and 5
- Non-capital expenditure

#### Out:

- Ongoing delivery costs
- Development of new standards through trailblazer groups
- Capital expenditure
- Funding for other third-party organisations



## **Expected timeline and next steps**



A potential second wave of funding may be announced in spring 2024, subject to DfE funding confirmation for FY 2024-25. We anticipate the September 2023 bidding guidance is likely to remain in place.




